### Pride of Judea Home Annual Linen Shower

Children's Institution to Benefit  
by Affair on June 14 and 15.

The annual Linen and Clothing Shower of the Pride of Judea Children's Home will be held on Sunday and Monday, June the 14th and 15th, in the Home Building, which is located on Dumont ave., Elton and Linwood sts., from 11 A. M. to 12 o'clock midnight.

The institution, of which Max Blumberg, well-known philanthropist and communal worker, is president, is caring for several hundred orphaned and underprivileged children and has just completed the addition of a new floor to its former structure. The other floors are also being remodeled to conform in modernity to the new one, and will have Open House on these two days, at which time all members and friends of the institution can inspect the new addition and the improvements.

The Home derives a good part of its annual supply of linens and clothing from this affair, and with the increase of its population made possible by the new addition, their needs are greater than ever before.

The committee in charge of this affair is working to make this affair a success. A musical program in which the Pride of Judea Children's Home Band will take part has been arranged for the entertainment of the guests.

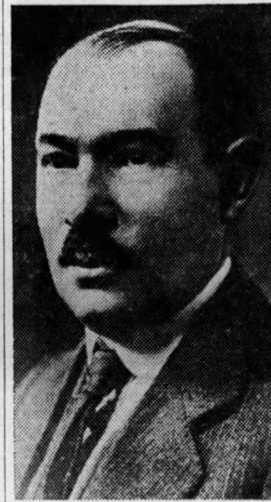
The plaque, which consists of a life size bust, together with an inscription, is a gift from the board of directors of the sanitarium in honor of Mr. Blumberg's twelve successive terms as head of the boro institution.

Among those who will pay honor to the widely-known philanthropist are Supreme Court Justice Mitchell May, County Judge Algeron I. Nova, City Court Justice Alexander Gelsmar, Herman S. Bachrach, president of the Brooklyn Bar Association, Rabbi I. H. Levinthal of the Brooklyn Jewish Center, Rabbi Harry Halperin, of the East Midwood Jewish Center and Supreme Court Justice Edward J. Lazansky.

A unique feature of the dedication will be the rendition of a song written in honor of Mr. Blumberg, by the inmate band of the sanitarium. Eddie Brown, crippled leader, composed the song.

The Jewish Sanitarium for Incurables, at present a 500 bed hospital for the treatment of chronic diseases, was built largely through the efforts of Mr. Blumberg, who organized a group of friends for such a purpose in 1924. Ground was broken for the original building the following year. In 1932 a 6-story wing was added. At present plans a re under way to erect another building to house crippled children.

Besides being president of the Incurables, Mr. Blumberg is also president of the Pride of Judea Or-

phan Asylum; chairman of the Williamsburg division of the Zionist Organization of America; executive director of the Beth Moses Hospital; member of the American Jewish Congress; director of the Yeshivah Tirah Chadeth and founder of the Max Blumberg Sick Relief Society.
