

Minkin Pledges \$150,000 Toward Fund For JCDH

One hundred and fifty thousand dollars at the Thirty-Eighth Anniversary Dinner of the Jewish Chronic Disease Hospital, Brooklyn, by David Minkin, one of New York's leading builders and realtors, towards the \$3 million campaign for the Jewish Chronic Disease Hospital's projected surgical pavilion.

MR. MINKIN is a vice president of the institution and was chairman of the dinner which was held in the grand ballroom of the Waldorf Astoria.

The dinner was a testimonial to Isaac Albert, president of the hospital, in honor of his forthcoming 75th birthday and his 20th year as president of this, the largest voluntary, non-sectarian institution for the care and treatment of the chronic sick.

Tributes to Mr. Albert were paid by Comptroller Abraham D. Beame, New York State Supreme Court Justices, Hon. Hyman Barshay and Hon. Walter R. Hart and Hon. Aaron L. Jacoby.

HAL MARCH, chairman of "Chronic Disease Hospital Month," received the institution's "Citation of Honor" from Herman W. Shane, chairman of the hospital's board of directors.

Presentations were also made to Mr. Minkin by Boro President Abe Stark and to Mr. Albert by Harry Hershfield who served as toastmaster.

"Woman of the Year" scrolls were presented to representatives of each of the hospital's forty auxiliaries for their work.
