

Jewish Sanitarium Synagogue Named

The Jewish Sanitarium and Hospital for Chronic Diseases, 86 E. 49th St., named its new synagogue "Congregation Joseph Chaim Albert" in ceremonies held there yesterday afternoon. The synagogue is named in honor of the father of Isaac Albert, hospital president.

Albert accepted an engraved scroll honoring his 86-year-old father, from the hands of Rabbi Solomon B. Shapiro of Congregation B'nai Abraham. The elder Mr. Albert was present at the ceremony.

Rabbi Levie Belitzky of the hospital staff presented the president with a silver wine cup.

Speakers were Deputy Mayor Charles Horowitz, Rabbi Abraham I. Faivelson, director of the Rabbinical Board of Greater New York; Rabbi Meyer Sharf and Samuel Kaplan and Samuel Neimitz, gabbis (sextons) of the new synagogue.
