

## AUXILIARY PROCLAIMS DR. LOUIS D. GROSS AS MOST POPULAR RABBI

The Auxiliary to the Jewish Sanitarium for Incurables at its open meeting on Thursday evening, September 15, at the Justine Ballrooms, proclaimed Dr. Louis D. Gross of Union Temple, the most popular Rabbi in Brooklyn. Dr. Gross addressed the Auxiliary on the need for a Jewish sanitarium in the county. He related a number of experiences at the Kings County Hospital and showed the great part in Jewish life that will be played by the sanitarium which is being erected at Rutland road and East 49th street.

Dr. Gross, who is director of the Jewish Sanitarium for Incurables, highly praised Max Blumberg, president of the organization, for his great philanthropy and interest in charity. Dr. Gross extended an invitation to the members of the Auxiliary to attend the services at the Union Temple.

The occasion for Dr. Gross's address was the opening meeting, entertainment and dance of the Auxiliary of which Samuel Douglas was chairman. It was stated that the organization had given over \$2,500 toward the erection of the sanitarium within the past year. Samuel Douglas, who is the Republican candidate for Member of Assembly in the 19th Assembly District, was praised by Dr. Gross for his interest in social and charity work.

The entertainment for the evening was provided by Murray Goldman, a member and prominent camp entertainer.
