

TO LAY STONE FOR NEW SANITARIUM ON SUNDAY

The cornerstone of the Jewish Sanitarium for Incurables will be laid Sunday at 2 p. m. All preparations are completed to make this occasion one of the most important in the history of Brooklyn Jewish institutions and representatives of all Brooklyn Jewish synagogues are expected to attend, according to Max Blumberg, chairman of the building committee, who is also president of the organization. Automobile parades will start from Williamsburg and other points in Brooklyn to the site of the Jewish Sanitarium, Rutland road and Utica avenue now in course of construction.

It is planned, as soon as the sanitarium is ready to remove the Jewish incurables, about 200 in number, from the Kings County Hospital to the Jewish home, where they will find Jewish surroundings and kosher food.

A call has previously been sent out by Mr. Blumberg to all Brooklyn organizations and synagogues to send committees to the celebration and he has requested them to initiate a movement among the membership to help as much as they can so that the home may open as soon as possible. Temporary offices of the home are at No. 7 Graham avenue.
